PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Each December, as the year comes to a close, I take time to reflect on our cooperative and the strides we have made as an organization to ensure safe, reliable and affordable electric service and continued excellence in customer service. This year, Piedmont Electric's focus has been set firmly on improving our connection with each and every one of our members who make up this electric cooperative.

Every year, we survey a percentage of our membership, so we can better understand the needs of our members and identify areas for improvement. This year, we took it a step further and ran an electronic focus group with a random sampling of our members. This focus group allowed electronic conversations not only between the cooperative and participating members, but also between the participants. From this process, we have gained invaluable information about the needs of members from across our cooperative.

We have already begun to implement new programs based on your suggestions. Our social media presence is growing and is now equipped to provide up-to-date

information during major outages, so our members can stay informed on restoration progress if the power goes out. We also continue to provide our members more information about their electric usage through the SmartHub system, calculators and applications on our website, pemc.coop.

Overall, Piedmont Electric had a successful financial year and therefore, we are able to retire capital credits to members who were active in 1987 (see page 20). So why doesn't everybody get a capital credits retirement check each year? Every year, margins are allocated to the account of each member. That money allocated to each member's account is used as "working capital" to ensure that the cooperative doesn't have to take on additional debt to maintain and upgrade your power

distribution system. This "working capital" reduces the need for your co-op to borrow money, which keeps your electric rates as low as possible. In keeping with the seven guiding cooperative principles, we do retire capital credits from previous years if financial conditions allow the board of directors to approve. If we were to retire capital credits to every member, every year, your electric rates would increase, which is contrary to our goal of keeping rates as low as possible.

We look forward to exploring even more ways to better serve you in the coming year. I hope each of you has a safe holiday season and a happy new year. Thank you for your continued support of Piedmont Electric Membership Corporation.

PIEDMONT EMC ANNOUNCES RETIREMENT OF LONG-TIME BOARD MEMBER



After 42 years, Piedmont Electric Board Member, Richard C. Roberts, announced his retirement this past August, 2015. Mr. Roberts

first began his tenure on the board of directors for district 8 in 1973. Mr. Roberts brought with him a knowledge of the cooperative business thanks to the legacy of his father, Mr. Clyde Roberts of Hillsborough, NC, a founding board member of Piedmont Electric. Mr. Roberts served on the board during a pivotal time

in our history as the co-op began to embrace new technologies and venues that would help us lead the cooperative nation into the future.

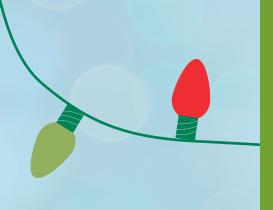
Mr. Roberts also served with distinction as chairman of the board of directors for Piedmont from 1987 until 2011. During those years of service, Mr. Roberts provided exemplary leadership as chairman of the board, fostering growth and encouraging change, which has made a lasting impact on Piedmont Electric. In addition to his duties as chairman, Mr. Roberts remained a dedicated family man, an active member in his church, community and family farm,

Little River Farm in Hillsborough, NC. Mr. Roberts was also a retired veteran of the United States Army.

Upon his retirement from the board, Mr. Roberts was appointed to the title of director emeritus, effective as of August 18, 2015. The board of directors wants to recognize Mr. Robert's considerable contributions to Piedmont Electric, and desires to maintain a continuing relationship with him, so the information and knowledge he has acquired will benefit the cooperative. We thank Mr. Roberts for his strong and thoughtful leadership over the years and his dedicated service to this cooperative.

HOLIDAY ELECTRICAL SAFETY TIPS

It's the holiday season – the most wonderful time of the year! It can also be the most stressful and potentially dangerous, particularly when it comes to keeping your family safe through parties, presents, travel and meals. Follow these tips to protect your family this holiday season.



Inspect your seasonal decorations for brittle or damaged wiring...

...worn switches and corroded metal parts... ...broken legs, unstable bases and other tipping hazards.

Don't tamper with safety devices. Fuses, switches and other safety features are designed to keep you safe. Remember, if your plugs won't fit together, it means they weren't designed to work together.

Look for power lines. For outdoor decorations, make sure you look up before getting started. Identify power lines and make sure you aren't anywhere close to the power lines or the ladder while decorating.

Consider traffic-prone areas in your home. Sometimes in the hustle of the holiday season, we forget to think about how children and pets will interact with our decorations. Make sure you think about areas where your children and pets spend a lot of time, to ensure that you don't inadvertently create a disaster area.

2015 CAPITAL CREDITS RETIREMENT

If you were a member of Piedmont Electric Membership Corporation in 1987, you will soon receive your share of capital credits for that year.

One of the major benefits of being a member of Piedmont EMC is that you are returned any money that is left over after all of our bills have been paid. The amount of these funds you receive is based on the amount you paid for the electricity consumed during the year of the retirement.

General retirement checks will be mailed to eligible members with owed retirements of \$20 or higher. Those who have capital credit accounts less than \$20 will see a credit on their energy bill. Inactive accounts will receive a check providing there is a current mailing address on file. Inactive members with less than \$20 in their capital credits account will have their payments held until the \$20 minimum is met in a future year.

The 2015 general retirement of capital credits will involve retiring approximately \$1,270,000 this year. In addition, over \$200,000 was returned to the estates of deceased members this year.

Your cooperative membership entitles you to this capital credit retirement whenever Piedmont EMC is financially able to approve these refunds and receives approval by the board of directors. Until a specific year is "retired" the funds are used for maintenance of the electrical grid and to allow Piedmont EMC to meet the financial requirements of our lenders. Piedmont Electric has returned over \$21 million dollars in capital credits to members since 1975.

NEW COOPERATIVE SOLAR PROJECT

Piedmont EMC's Roxboro branch office is installing a 200kW solar field on one acre of land adjacent to the office to help power the office. Any excess generation of energy will be placed back on our electric grid. Installation began in October, 2015. Piedmont EMC also has plans to install a 300kW solar field at the Caswell branch office soon. Stay tuned for more project updates on our social media, website and future newsletters.
