PIEDMONT ELECTRIC AWARDS \$750,000 LOAN TO THE TOWN OF YANCEYVILLE

The Town of Yanceyville is expanding its municipal fire station with the help of Piedmont Electric Membership Corporation. Piedmont Electric has awarded the town a \$750,000 zero-interest loan to aid in the expansion of the Yanceyville Municipal Fire Department.

The loan funds are available in partnership with the United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Rural Economic Development Loan and Grant (REDLG) program, which provides zero-interest funding to local electric cooperatives, such as Piedmont Electric. The cooperatives, in turn, lend this money to local businesses and governments for projects that support rural areas.

The loan is for the addition of 4,916 square feet to the Yanceyville Fire Department building, which was constructed in the late 1960s. The new addition is of masonry construction, containing two truck bays with 13'x14' glass bay doors, training room for approximately 40 persons, sleeping quarters for four firefighters, accessible restrooms with showers, storage areas, two offices and a reception and work area.

The project also includes reroofing, masonry facade, and egress improvements to the existing building that include replacement and upgrade of the existing bay doors to match the two new glass bay doors, site work, and additional paved off-street parking for 15 vehicles.

According to the Town Manager, Brian Collie, "Partnering with Piedmont Electric through their community loan program made this project possible. We have been able to enhance the functionality of our fire station, including the addition of training facilities, as well as enhance the look of our downtown area."

"Piedmont Electric is proud to support this project," says President and CEO Randy Brecheisen. "The cooperative's structure was created to support the community. This zero-interest loan allows us to support our communities far beyond our electric service."

A portion of the funds, once repaid, will be added to the electric cooperative's community revolving loan fund, which will be re-loaned to assist with future projects in the Piedmont Electric area.



Energy-Saving Tips for

RENTERS AND HOMEOWNERS

Renters and homeowners alike have the ability to cut energy costs by implementing these 5 simple, low-cost ideas:

- Turn down thermostat (See below.)
- Change your air filter once a month.
- Reep curtains open in the daytime to naturally warm the house with direct sunlight. Keep them closed at night to keep out the chill.
- Purchase a window sealing kit at a home improvement store to combat drafty windows. These kits include plastic sheets that fit your window to seal out cool drafts. They can be easily removed without damage once winter is over:



- Turn off your computer when it's not in use. Keeping your computer on all the time can add up to as much as \$20/month on your electricity bill.
- Check the temperature on your water heater. It should be set no higher than I 20 degrees Fahrenheit for best efficiency.

CONTROL YOUR THERMOSTAT

During winter, you should set your thermostat as low as is comfortable. **Energy.gov** recommends setting the temperature at 68 degrees Fahrenheit to maximize energy efficiency.



EMERGENCY HEAT

If your thermostat has an emergency heat option, DO NOT use it unless it is truly an emergency, such as if the heat pump is broken. Electric heat pumps typically have two sources of heating, the primary heat pump and a supplemental

source. When you choose to use the emergency heat setting, your system will only use the supplemental source, bypassing the primary heat pump. Because it is set up as an emergency only system, it is much more expensive to run.

BYLAW REQUIREMENTS LISTED FOR NOMINATIONS OF DIRECTORS

The following is an excerpt from the bylaws pertaining to nominations.

SECTION 4.06. Nominations.

(A) NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

It shall be the duty of the Board to appoint a Nominations Committee consisting of ten (10) persons who are members but are not directors or close relatives of directors, and who are so selected that each of the Cooperative's Directorate Districts and the at large directorate shall have one representative thereon. The Committee shall meet and nominate candidates for each of the Cooperative's Directorate Districts to be elected at the next annual meeting and the at large director if that directorate is to be elected at the next annual meeting. The Committee shall nominate at least one (1) nominee for each such District and may nominate more than one (1) nominee for each such District. The Committee shall show clearly each nominee(s) and the Directorate District for which they are nominated. In addition, the Committee shall nominate each three (3) years at least one (1) candidate and may nominate more than one (1) candidate for the "at large" position. The Committee shall ensure that all members nominated meet the qualifications to serve as a director set forth in section 4.02. The Committee shall meet as necessary in order to complete its nominations no later than thirty days preceding the deadline for nomination by petition as is set forth in the following subsection to provide the opportunity for any qualified member who desires to be placed on the ballot at the upcoming annual meeting but not nominated by the Committee, to seek nomination by petition as set forth in the following subsection.

(B) NOMINATIONS BY PETITION

Any fifty (50) or more members of the Cooperative, acting together, may make additional nominations in writing over their signatures, in like manner listing the nominees separately with respect to the Directorate Districts from which they are nominated, on or before February 14 preceding the annual meeting at which such directors are to be elected. Any member nominated by petition as a candidate for any Directorate must meet the qualifications to serve as a director set forth in section 4.02 before the nominee's name may be placed on the ballot for election at the annual meeting.

(C) MAILING OF NOTICE OF ELECTIONS

The Secretary shall mail to the members with the notice of the meeting, or separately, or through any publication routinely used by the Cooperative for communication with the membership on a monthly basis at least seven (7) days and not more than forty-five (45) days prior to the meeting, the names of all nominees for each such district, showing separately those nominated by the Committee and those nominated by petition, if any.

(D) POSTING OF NOMINATIONS

Once the signatures of the members on any petition and the qualifications to serve of the nominees are verified. the names of all nominees for each directorate district and the names of each nominee for the at large directorate, if it is to be elected at the upcoming annual meeting, shall be posted at the principal office of the Cooperative. The Posted Notice of all nominees shall show the directorate for which each nominee seeks election as director and may indicate those nominated by the nominations committee and those nominated by petition.
