TOP 5 WAYS Renters

CAN SAVE ENERGY (AND MONEY)

If you are a renter, you may be wondering what you can do to make your home more energy efficient and save money. Traditional upgrades like more insulation or new appliances may be out of your control.

But, renters CAN save energy and money! Even simple changes can have a large impact on your energy bill. Here are five things you can do today that will help you save:

1

Install a programmable thermostat – Make sure to check your lease, but most rental units allow you to update appliances in your home, such as a thermostat, as long as you return or replace the original before leaving. Programmable thermostats can save up to \$150 a year in energy costs, and new "smart" thermostats can save even more by learning your habits and optimizing temperatures based on when you are at home.

Change your lighting – One of the easiest ways to save energy is to change the way you light your home. ENERGY STAR® estimates that changing to more efficient bulbs can save up to \$65 a year in energy costs. Turning off the lights helps too. Turning off a bulb that burns 8 hours a day will save you \$15 a year in energy costs!

Change your air filters – Dirty filters force your HVAC system to work longer to warm or cool your home. Changing your air filter regularly will not only keep your HVAC system functioning properly, but will help it run more efficiently too. We recommend changing your filter every three months, at a minimum. If you own indoor pets, you may need to change your filters more often.

Turn it off when not in use – We're all guilty of leaving the TV on when we leave for a quick trip to the store or leaving a fan running all day in an empty room. But if no one is home, most appliances or electronics don't need to be running. Try to turn off any devices when not in use, and you'll see measurable differences in your energy costs.

Wash laundry with cold water – About 90 percent of the energy you use to wash clothes goes to heating water. By using cold water (and cold water detergent) with your washing machine, you could save more than \$40 a year in energy costs!

TOP 5 WAYS Home Ouners CAN SAVE ENERGY (AND MONEY)

Springtime is a great opportunity for you to make upgrades to your home. If you're looking for projects that will update your home and help you save energy, here are some ideas to get you started in addition to the savings shown on the previous page.

1

Upgrade to ENERGY STAR® certified appliances – One of the fastest ways for homeowners to see savings on their energy bill is by updating their appliances. Switching all appliances to ENERGY STAR® certified products can save nearly \$750 over the lifetime of the products, according to the US Department of Energy.

2

Insulate your water heater tank – Your water heater needs proper insulation to keep it running efficiently. Older water heater tanks are often uninsulated and can lose much of the heat they generate. Insulating your water heater could save up to 16 percent in water heating costs. Also, make sure your water heater is set to 120° F. With that level of savings, this project pays for itself in just a year!

3

Install storm windows – Insulating storm windows can save your family up to 33 percent in heating and cooling costs per year. Plus, they are often a fraction of the cost of full replacement windows.

4

Seal air leaks with caulk – Air leaks in your home can waste a lot of energy. Hot air during the summer and cold air in the winter causes drafts – both of which make your HVAC system work harder to keep your home comfortable.

5
