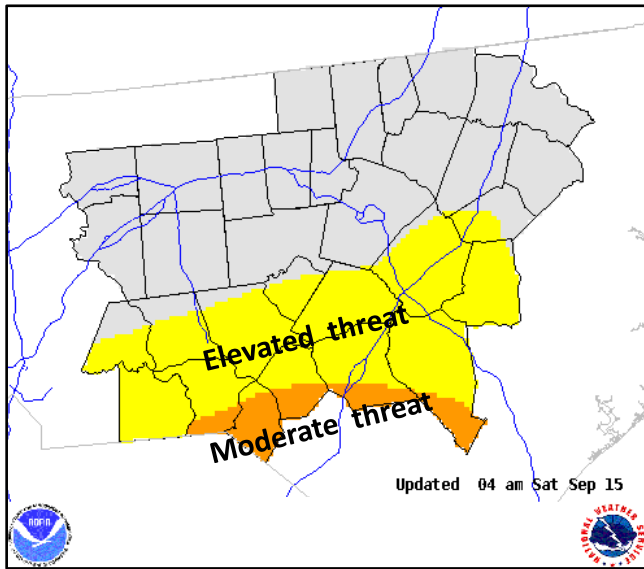


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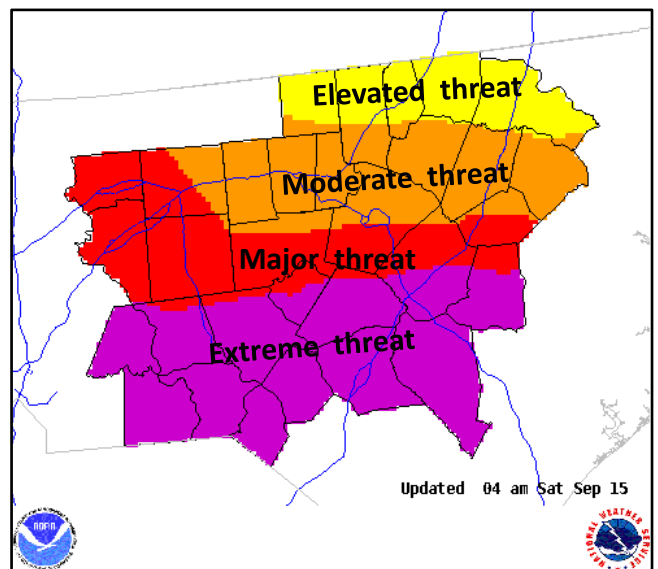

Dangerous TS Florence to Bring Life Threatening Impacts to Central NC

Tropical Storm Florence remains a powerful storm, drifting slowly southwest through eastern South Carolina. The storm will continue to meander westward across the Carolinas through Sunday before lifting north along the Appalachians. This will continue to spread heavy rains across the southern portions of North Carolina, which will likely lead to catastrophic flash and river flooding.

Key Points

- Tropical Storm Florence remains a powerful storm, with the worst impacts yet to arrive in the form of catastrophic Flash and River Flooding.
- Intense rain-bands will continue onshore today, resulting in 10-15 inches of additional rainfall in the southern Coastal Plain and Sandhills of NC.
- Moderate to major river flooding is expected into next week, especially across southern and eastern N.C.

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
