It's cheaper to cook at home than it is to stop by your favorite fast food place after work. As a bonus, food made at home is often healthier than what you pick up from a restaurant.

Set it and forget it

If you don't have a smart thermostat yet, now is the time to get one! It allows you to set a schedule for your heating and air conditioning system and even learns your behavior over time to make adjustments as needed. If you already have a Nest or Ecobee smart thermostat, sign up for our smart thermostat savings program at pemc.coop/thermostat to save even more energy and receive a \$50 rebate.



Remember that small changes add up

You don't have to make a big change to notice an improvement in your energy bill. Start small by replacing old lightbulbs in your home with energy-efficient LED bulbs, which use less electricity and can last years longer than incandescent bulbs.



Keep energy use top of mind

Through your SmartHub account, you can sign up for daily usage alerts, so you'll know exactly how much energy you use each day.
